PLANETAFILIA A.C. es una Asociación Civil que cree en el derecho internacional como instrumento para limitar y regular al poder político, económico y financiero mundial para así lograr una justicia social, la protección del medio ambiente el desarrollo sustentable y la paz mundial.

1.- Planetafilia a.c. nació en Guadalajara, Jalisco, en el año 2001 , con la propuesta de transformar la ONU en Federación Mundial de Naciones.

2.- En estos años ha trabajado intensamente a través de docenas de comunicados y cartas a las Naciones Unidas y a líderes de la Sociedad Civil Mundial que pueden ser consultados en la pagina web: www.planetafilia.org

3.- La máxima aportación de Planetafilia consiste en haber tomado la iniciativa **“no para reformar, sino para revisar la Carta de San Francisco de 1945.”** Con Fundamento en el artículo 109° de la propia Carta.

4.- El Procedimiento de revisión de la Carta ha sido relegado durante los 62 años de vida de la ONU y planetafilia se ha propuesto crear conciencia de que es un derecho vigente a favor de las 192 naciones miembros de la ONU, que puede legítimamente , **convocar a traves de la Asamblea General de la ONU con el quórum de dos terceras partes más nueve cualesquiera de los 15 Miembros del Consejo de Seguridad a una Conferencia General ad hoc que sin duda necesita la comunidad internacional para transformar la ONU en Federación Mundial de Naciones.**

Para ello hemos realizado las siguientes actividades:

1.- Hemos entablado contacto con la Presidencia de la República, la cual a través de la Secretaría Particular, por instrucciones del SR. Presidente Felipe Calderón, remitió nuestra propuesta para su análisis y atención a la Secretaría de Relaciones Exteriores.

2.- Por conducto del Embajador Pablo Macedo, Director General del Sistema de Naciones Unidas de la propia Secretaría, se dió respuesta a nuestras propuestas y fuimos informados de que PLANETAFILIA A.C, quedaría registrada en dicha dependencia como Miembro de La Sociedad Civil, que colabora con La Cancillería y hemos mantenido contacto con la dirección general de vinculación con La Sociedad Civil.

3.- Hemos visitado a la Senadora Rosario Green, Presidenta de La Comisión de Relaciones Exteriores del Senado y con el Senador Ángel Alonso Díaz Caneja Presidente de La Comisión de Organismos Internacionales, así como con otros Miembros del Congreso de La Unión. En particular está en trámite un Convenio de Colaboración con el Instituto de Investigaciones Legislativas del Senado de la República.





4.- Con el Gobierno del Estado de Jalisco también entablamos contacto y por instrucciones del Gobernador, se turnó nuestra propuesta de establecer una Oficina de La ONU en Jalisco a la Secretaría General de Gobierno, que está pendiente de resolución

5.- La Barra Mexicana Colegio de Abogados ha publicado nuestra propuesta en su revista mensual "La Barra" y hemos impartido varias conferencias en las Comisiones de Derecho Internacional y de Derechos Humanos de dicha Barra en la ciudad de México. En el capítulo Jalisco de la misma Barra, también hemos dado a conocer nuestras propuestas.

6.- En el Congreso de la Federación Interamericana de Abogados (FIA) que se llevó a cabo en la ciudad de México en el mes de junio del 2007, hicimos entrega del principal ensayo de carácter jurídico y político que contiene el procedimiento de la REVISION INTEGRAL DE LA CARTA DE LA ONU y SU FUNDAMENTO LEGAL, para su eventual transformación en FEDERACIÓN MUNDIAL DE NACIONES. Publicación de dicho ensayo en La Memoria del Congreso de la FIA (Federación Internacional de Abogados), que se puede consultar en la página Web.: www.iaba.org

7.- En estos 6 años de vida hemos realizado más de cincuenta comunicados y diversas publicaciones en revistas especializadas, así como participaciones en muy diversos foros de la sociedad civil a nivel Nacional e Internacional.

8.- En el ámbito internacional, nos hemos asociado al MOVIMIENTO FEDERALISTA MUNDIAL (WFM, www.wmf.org) con oficinas en Nueva York y la Haya, que cuenta con más de cuarenta miembros y ONG's asociadas en los cinco continentes.

a) Recientemente hemos participado en las Juntas del Consejo General del WFM y en el último congreso internacional un representante de Planetafilia fue electo, fue electo Consejero. Se logró incluir en las Conclusiones del Congreso (que se celebra cada cuatro años) el apoyo a las iniciativas que sus miembros promuevan, para la Revisión de la Carta de la ONU de acuerdo al Artículo 109, que significa un nuevo camino de renovación de la ONU.

b) En dicho Congreso del WFM, entablamos contacto con el Secretario Ejecutivo de la Campaña por la Asamblea Parlamentaria con las Naciones Unidas (UNPA, <http://en.unpacampaign.org/news/253.php>) Dr. Andreas Bummel, quien invitó a PLANETAFILIA a formar parte del Comité Organizador de la Campaña para el 2008 con el carácter de socio y representante de UNPA para la República Mexicana.





- c) Posteriormente asistimos a la Reunión del Comité Preparatorio de esta Campaña de UNPA para 2008, a fines de noviembre de 2007 en Ginebra, Suiza, logrando extender los lazos y relaciones de PLANETAFILIA con las más importantes ONG's, vinculadas a la propuesta de un futuro Parlamento Mundial con plenas facultades legislativas, que colabore paralelamente con las Naciones Unidas.
- d) Por otra parte PLANETAFILIA convocó a una docena de ONG's Internacionales interesadas en formar parte de este Comité ad hoc para la REVISION DE LA CARTA de San Francisco y se celebró la primera reunión en al Ciudad de Nueva York el 16 de Noviembre del 2007. A la fecha ya se han dando sus primeros pasos hacia una Alianza Mundial por la Transformación de la ONU (WATUN por sus siglas en inglés).

9.- A nivel académico la Institución que ha brindado un apoyo decidido a PLANETAFILIA ha sido la UNIVERSIDAD de GUADALAJARA, que va desde nuestra participación en el Primer Congreso de Derecho Internacional Dr. Sergio García Ramírez, organizado por el Centro Universitario del Sur en mayo del 2005 y la realización de tres Foros: En Noviembre del 2005, Octubre 2006 y Noviembre 2007. En este último foro PLANETAFILIA propuso a los participantes celebrar el Primer Modelo de Naciones Unidas para la Revisión de la Carta, mediante la convocatoria a una Conferencia General de Miembros(ART 109).

10.- Consecuentemente, en los días 24 y 25 de abril de 2008, se llevó a cabo "El 1er Modelo de Conferencia General de Miembros, para la Revisión de la Carta en San Francisco", con el apoyo decidido de la Universidad de Guadalajara y la participación de conferencistas de los Estados Unidos de América, Francia, y, Japón; Así como la participación de más de 400 estudiantes de las carreras de Derecho, Estudios Internacionales y Estudios Políticos.

11.- El comité ad-hoc para la Revisión de la Carta de la ONU, se convirtió en La Alianza Mundial para la Transformación de las Naciones Unidas, a partir del día 26 de abril de 2008, con la participación de varias ONG'S internacionales, incluyendo a Planetafilia A.C. y a algunos estudiantes de la Universidad de Guadalajara.



Toward Democratic World Federation

PEACE SECURED BY WORLD FEDERATION AND DISARMAMENT

Marion Haines McVitty (1912-1971), a well known personality at the United Nations, also well known there at the time of her death, served as official U.N. Observer for the World Movement for World Federal Government. A native of Providence, she had grown up in Rhode Island, attended Oxford University for one year and then the Yale University Divinity School. Her first husband, Alfred Star Teichgraber, was killed during the Second World War; her second husband, Edward McVitty, who had also worked to promote World Federalism, died in 1971.

Profound political moments can be personal ones. One evening during World War II, Marion McVitty, then living in New Haven, was listening to the radio. On that program, the commentator Dorothy Thompson was urging her listeners to read, really read, the *Federalist Papers* as a political, not just a historical document. Curiously, McVitty read right through and immediately became a "federalist." Reading the *Federalist Papers*, such as #2, where John Jay states that "nothing is more certain than the indispensable necessity of government, and it is equally undeniable, that whenever and however it is instituted, the people must cede to it some of their natural rights, in order to vest it with requisite powers."

Thus, Marion "thought of federation in universal terms." From the "Papers," she took James Madison, Alexander Hamilton, and John Jay's thesis that a strong national government is necessary for international stability and applied it to the world. "The end of world security threats (would peace) might only be secured through a world federal government. The death of McVitty's first husband in the final days of the war and the bombings of Hiroshima and Nagasaki solidified her realization of the necessity for a world federation and the hopefulness of working alone on the task. She became a prominent speaker for Americans United for World Federation, looking for a merger among world government organizations; she sought and found support for world federalism among unions, church and women's groups. A personal realization became a public quest.

McVitty believed that it is only through a strong world federation where international disputes are settled by peaceful procedures that true national security could become a reality. "That is the only realism in today's world. Those who would maintain the present system that has repeatedly generated wars and could continue to do so are misunderstanding us by calling themselves realists." She continued critics who denounced world federation as futile and naive: "Any society (the U.S. for example) can be set up under laws so that their people can reap mutual benefits from their interrelationships, and any conflicts that arise between them may be rationally settled by peaceful legal procedures." She did not just see the world as it is, she also saw how it should be and worked to make the two pictures congruent.



Japan and Transforming the United Nations

After a short meeting with John Senter and Shobhar Shree of the Democratic World Federalists in San Francisco, California, I took the plane to Japan to attend the 1st World Conference of Researching Realization of the World Federation June 24th -26th, 2008, organized by the Rikiko Kaneko Representative of the Academic Society of Sapporo University, Japan.

Mr. Yasuhiro Ogino, Vice-President of WFM Japan, provided an excellent historical review of the World Federalist Movement Japan since the end of World War II to our present time. Along with other Japanese guests, he mentioned the remarkable resolution of the Japanese Parliament in favor of World Federalism.

Dr. Klaus Schlichmann, Historian and Project Manager of "Movement for U.S. Reform 2007" (Centenary of the Second Hague Peace Conference) and Lecturer of Nihon University, made an interesting analysis regarding Article 9 of the Japanese Constitution, which requests a historic precedent of a nation-state determination to abolish war and give up the absolute sovereignty concept, that would certainly help to understand and accept a world federal government by all nation-state members of the U.N.

Araon Marín, Professor of International Law at the University of Guadalajara, presented a very interesting paper titled "The Role of the International Court of Justice in the Transition towards World Federalism." He concluded that if the ICJ could survive the League of Nations there is no doubt that it may survive the U.N.; whether federalism comes fast or slowly, the ICJ will have a role in achieving World Federalism. He also felt that although not ideally equipped, there is no institution better equipped than the ICJ to handle structural and legal disputes related to a World Federation.

Anastasia Makarova, young federalist from the Siberian Institute of International Relationship and Regology and Member of the Preparatory Committee of the World Federation Governance, presented the conclusions of a survey made in her research among students 19-21 years old. This research is an effective instrument for making people aware of the necessity of a world federal government. Besides that remarkable work she presented a draft titled "Statute of World Federation of Youth Association."

Adrián Palés, a law student from the University of Guadalajara endorsed working with the World Federation of Youth Association and committed himself to promote that association among the students in Mexico.

Professor Rikiko Kaneko presented a draft Charter of the World Federation Governance which contains a substantial proposal for an outstanding organizational structure and "The Union Statute of the World Federation Papers," that in the future may be a valuable instrument to promote World Federalism. Article 1, Paragraph 2, of such document mentions cooperation with the World Alliance for Transforming the U.N. (WATUN) and also expresses concerns about the failures the existing international system, where the citizen's fundamental rights and those of the States are not sufficiently guaranteed because of the lack of general international legislation and absence of the votes by the Security Council's permanent members. Besides that, the U.N. International Court of Justice does not have, in principle, jurisdiction when there is not an agreement between the parties, and international society is far from a community governed by the "rule of law."

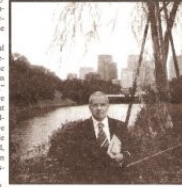
I had the opportunity to refer Planetafilia, A.C. a Mexican NGO that has been working on the proposal for U.N. transformation into a World Federation of Nations. Planetafilia was invited as an Associated Organization of WFM and as the Secretary's head of WATUN. We analyzed the theory that based on the 1945 U.N. Charter, it is impossible to enforce any reform to the Charter without the unanimous consent of the five veto-carrying members of the Security Council (Art. 108). It is also claimed that if there were an attempt to modify the Charter through a General Conference (Art. 109, Par. 2), it would be a waste of time for the same reason that the modification or alteration of the Charter itself, could be voted by any of the five Permanent Members.

Contrary to that theory one can avoid the vote of the five permanent members, through a call of the General Assembly, not to reform or alter the U.N. Charter, but for its entire review according to Article 109. As a consequence of such review, it is possible to start the procedure of transformation of the U.N. based on the well-known principles of international law (as opposed and particularly the right of self-determination of peoples, recognized by the Preamble of the 1945 San Francisco Charter).

This means that during the transformation process, the U.N. Charter remains organic without any alteration and all the organic structure and programs of the U.N. would be instituted and legally empowered.

At the end of the Conference, June 26th, Professor Rikiko Kaneko presented a draft Sapporo Declaration, which was signed by participants at the Plenary Session held in Toyoko, Hokkaido Island, Japan, where the 6th Summit would later be held on July 7-8, 2008.

Finally, I expressed my gratitude to the University of Sapporo and my deepest recognition that Japan is not only a rich culture, but a great civilization in favor of world peace through law and world federal government, as was already approved by a landmark resolution in the Japanese Parliament.

UN FEDERALISTS REUNITE AFTER 43 YEARS

After 43 years of separate existence, Federal Union and the Association of World Federalists have reunited. The AWF was founded by members of Federal Union back in 1965 to focus more on issues of federalism at a more global level. A summer's worth of negotiations for a reunification culminated at a meeting held in London on Saturday 6 September 2008 at which the reunification was approved (with only one dissenting voice). The day opened with a seminar addressed by Michael Burgess, professor of federal studies at the University of Kent, and Keith Best, chair of the AWF Council and chair of the WFM Executive Committee. The political debate was followed by a business session in which the terms of the reunification were agreed. The statutes of the new organization are based on the former statutes of Federal Union, although specific posts for Deputy Chairs are included to ensure neither European nor world federalism is neglected in the future workplan. Elections for a new committee will be held at an Annual General Meeting in March 2009. Until then, the organization will be led by a committee composed of all the existing members of the two previous committees. The organization will preserve the name Federal Union, which it first adopted in 1938, and will be a member organization of both UEF and WFM. The organization will focus on federalism at UN, European and global levels, with a particular interest in issues where different levels overlap. By Richard Lansing, Director of Federal Union

WELCOME NEW WFM DIRECTOR OF PROGRAMS!

At the end of July, Ms. Jelena Pija Cornella joined our staff as the new WFM Director of Programs, bringing over 15 years of experience in international relations and a deep knowledge of the UN system to the WFM International Secretariat.

Ms. Pija Cornella began her career in 1996 as a diplomat representing the country of Andorra to the UN, US and Canada. In 2002 Ms. Pija Cornella was appointed Deputy Permanent Representative of Andorra to the UN, responsible for coordinating and overseeing Andorra's overall participation at the UN, as well as maintaining and fostering Andorra's relationships with other countries. In addition, Ms. Pija Cornella served as Charge d'affaires at the UN Mission in the US and Canada from 2003 to 2007. In 2008, Ms. Pija Cornella joined the Center for Women's Global Leadership and the Women's Environment and Development Organization (WEDO) as a consultant to coordinate the Gender Equality Architecture Reform Campaign (GEAR), a coalition of over 270 NGOs for the purpose of strengthening the gender equality machinery at the UN. Fluent in Catalan, English, French and Spanish she has already proved a welcome and invaluable member of our team.

WFM MEMBERS PARTICIPATE IN THE G8 RELIGIOUS LEADERS SUMMIT

Approximately 50 foreign delegates and scholars, in addition to 100 Japanese religious leaders met to focus on common concerns of world faith at the G8 Religious Leaders Summit in Osaka and Kyoto, Japan from 27 to 29 June 2008. The event was coordinated and arranged by Yoshihiko Miyake and WFM Council Vice Chair, Most Rev. Mitsuo Miyake. WFM Council Chair, Rev. Dr. James Christie, served as a Special Advisor and WFM Councilor. Rev. Dr. James Hamilton, served as a member of the Expert Committee. As participants of one of the key assemblies of inter-religious dialogue, leaders agreed not to engage in theological debates, but to engage in discussions revolving around the theme "Living with the Earth. Message from World Religions." This was the third summit at which religious leaders focused on sending a common declaration to the leaders of the Group of Eight, which met in Hokkaido 7 to 9 July 2008. Leaders addressed the current environmental crisis, called for the G8 to condemn the suppression of religious and other freedoms in countries such as Tibet and Myanmar, and emphasized the critical necessity of education in the development of global community. Ultimately it was recognized that common to all religious traditions was the belief that "justice and the preservation of human rights must be given primary," and that all sought "to be considered equal partners in the solution of these entangled problems."

CALL FOR UN PARLIAMENTARY ASSEMBLY GAINS MOMENTUM

Support for the establishment of a United Nations Parliamentary Assembly (UNPA) has been growing continuously since its launch in April 2007. The campaign's appeal for the creation of a UN body composed of elected representatives has attracted support from more than 520 members of parliament from over 80 countries. Inspired by the campaign, the Pan-African Parliament passed a resolution endorsing the proposal in October 2007. The Latin American Parliament Commission on Political Affairs in June 2008 adopted a similar declaration in favor of a UNPA, inviting "all parliamentary organizations to participate actively in the process of its creation." The President of the Parliamentary Assembly of the Council of Europe, UK Lord Marko de Puig de Spain stated in a campaign media release that "the establishment of a UN Parliamentary Assembly would be an important step to bring the UN closer to the world's citizens."

In November 2007 campaign representatives met Geneva for the first international UNPA conference, convened under the patronage of former UN Secretary-General Boutros Boutros-Ghali. During the meeting Sans government observers expressed their government's "sympathy" for the proposal to create a parliamentary body at the UN. By June 2008, this stance was made public in an official government report. In addition to these government supporters, 150 NGOs organizations (including WFM AGF) have also endorsed the campaign. In November 2008 the campaign Steering Committee will meet in Brussels to reflect on its activities thus far and to coordinate plans for 2009. The next major step is to inspire as many national parliaments as possible around the world to express their support for a UNPA and to continue to broaden the base of NGO support. PLANETAFILIA CREATING AWARENESS FOR UN CHARTER REVIEW AND TRANSFORMATION

This year has been fruitful for Planetafilia's activism through its institute and partnership with other international NGOs. In February 2008, Planetafilia signed a Collaboration Agreement with the United Nations Association of Mexico (UNA-Mexico) to promote the Millennium Development Goals among children. Planetafilia also joined the UNPA Campaign, promoting it at the Mexican Federal Congress and at the University of Guadalajara.

Planetafilia is currently organizing the 10th International Forum on Article 28 of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights. 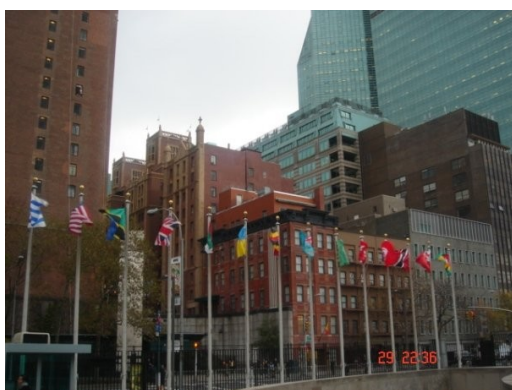
One of this year's highlights for Planetafilia came on 24 to 25 April when its Institute and the University of Guadalajara, in collaboration with the International Ad-Hoc Committee for Transforming the UN, organized a conference for students, academics and civil society, calling for a General Conference to Review the UN Charter. The Conference concluded with participants signing the "Guadalajara Declaration" calling for a General Conference to Review the UN Charter with the hope of transforming it into a World Federation of Nations.

On 26 April the International Ad-Hoc Committee created the World Alliance for Transforming the UN (WATUN) and established its Secretariat in Guadalajara, Mexico.

In June Planetafilia participated in "The World Conference for the Research and Realization of a World Federation" in Hokkaido, Japan. The event, organized

También visitamos de nuevo la oficina del Presidente de la Mesa Directiva del Senado y entregamos de nuevo la propuesta de UNPA a la Senadora Adriana González Carrillo, Secretaria de la Comisión de Relaciones Exteriores del Senado.

22. El día 22 de enero sostuvimos la segunda reunión con Stephanie Black de la Oficina del Alto Comisionado de las Naciones Unidas para los Derechos Humanos, con la idea de organizar en la Ciudad de México el Segundo Modelo de Conferencia General de Miembros de la ONU con el tema de la Revisión de la Carta de San Francisco, para llevarse a cabo en la Comunidad Universitaria de la Ciudad de México y abierto a ONG'S interesadas en el tema. A este respecto, Patricia Herrera y Laura Plancarte manifestaron su deseo de colaborar.

23. El 23 de enero se tuvo un acercamiento con el Diputado Federal del PRI Lic. Carlos Armando Briebrich Torres, Secretario de la Comisión de Puntos Constitucionales de la Cámara de Diputados del Congreso de la Unión, para promover la firma de la Campaña Para el Establecimiento de la Asamblea Parlamentaria en las Naciones Unidas (UNPA) y ocurrimos de nuevo a las oficinas del Senador Gustavo Madero, Senador Jorge Ocejo y Senadora Adriana González del PAN, con el fin de entregar los formatos de aprobación y firma de la Campaña de UNPA.



24. El 22 y 23 de enero se realizaron dos reuniones en el Congreso del Estado de Jalisco para presentar la Campaña de UNPA teniendo como resultado el apoyo de 12 Diputados Locales que firmaron la carta de adhesión de UNPA



Finalmente expresamos nuestra firme convicción de que la propuesta de PLANETAFILIA A.C. y puesta en marcha de nuevas ideas, actividades y propuestas de la Sociedad Civil Mundial a favor de un nuevo Sistema Jurídico y Político internacional otorgan la fuerza capaz de afrontar los retos del Siglo XXI, con fundamento en el artículo 28 de Declaración Universal de Derechos Humanos y el artículo 109 de la Carta de la ONU.
